Rico is in overall charge of the Angela Peralta Theater, the next-door Municipal Center for the Arts, and all aspects of Carnival Mazatlan.

The CULTURA offices are located on Avenida Aleman, almost at the corner of Belisario Dominguez, and at times tickets for cultural events are sold at that office as well as at the box office of the Angela Peralta Theater. (Tel. no. 982-4447)

# WHY FOM MAINTAINS A BLOOD DONOR LIST

The question has been asked as to why we need to have a Blood Donor List for the Friends of México. In México, and here in Mazatlán there is NO storage facility for blood and so when there is a need for blood at any of the hospitals, a call goes out to the community for prospective donors and then the screening process begins.

Friends of México have for the past several years maintains a donor list from which we have been called upon many times by the community when a blood need has occurred. We have been able to provide donors for those who have been both Ex-pats and local Mexican people in need of blood. This is a service for our members and the community at large.

There are certain restrictions that apply to donors. There is an age limit which in an emergency is waived. There are certain medications that preclude donors as well as some diseases that a donor may have had sometime in the past. This information is

noted at the time of screening and so we need a large pool to draw from in order to get the best available donors when needed.

When a call for a certain blood type is received by the chairperson of member services, the list of donors for that type of blood is accessed and those people, if they are in Mazatlán, are called. They then go to Sharp Hospital and are screened. We have been very fortunate that we have been able to find donors within an hour every time we have been requested to provide needed blood.

In addition to the FOM donor list, the local residents directory which is published by Henry Laxin maintains a list of donors and many of us are on the list also. If you are not, please consider do that as well. This is a community service that is life saving and in an emergency, sometimes the difference between life and death. If you are not on the FOM donor list, be sure to sign up with member services at the meeting. If you do not know your blood type, you can get that done at Sharp Hospital.

**REMEMBER – YOUR BLOOD CAN SAVE A LIFE!**

**FRIENDS OF MEXICO BOARD MEETING  
MAY 2, 2006**

Due to the fact that there was not a quorum present, the meeting was relocated to the home of Majid Mir so that Bob Rykman could email a proxy to Rebecca Caven.

In attendance: Majid, Rebecca, Fr. Jim and Jacque, Susan Silva by proxy and Bob Ryckkman by proxy. A quorum was established as Fr. Jim had a proxy from Susan Silva and Rebecca had a proxy from Bob Ryckman.

The minutes from the previous meeting were read, and approved with the following with changes. On page 5 paragraph 5... "She also noted that Friends of Mexico had contributed thirty percent (30%) to the cost of windows for *Jose Felipe Valle*, while the city contributed the balance." This sentence needs to be changed to: She also noted that Friends of Mexico had contributed thirty percent (30%) to the cost of the windows for *Josefina Osuna Perez*, while the city contributed the balance.

MOTION: Fr. Jim made a motion to accept the minutes as corrected.

Majid seconded the motion.

Motion approved.

Juan Antonio Cevallos the Director of Construction at Marina Mazatlan will be the guest speaker at the May 9<sup>th</sup> general meeting. Majid will confirm the details with Jeannette Sasrasin who will be bringing him to the meeting.

Fr. Jim will stop by Los Zarapes to remind them that will be there on the 9<sup>th</sup> and that we would like to have access again to their electronic equipment. Lynne Hopkins and Lee Story are going to speak at the meeting about their success with special incentive programs at Sor Juana.

Susan Silva and Rebecca Caven will host the FOM board and general meetings during Majids absence. Due to the absence of Susan and Bruce the progress of converting FOM financial to MSN Money, and the discussion of future FOM trips, activities and events were postponed. Since the majority of the planning for these trips is completed, the board is going to ask that volunteers from our membership sign on to spear head the finalizing of each trip. (Providing information at the meeting about the trip, tickets sales, etc.) Then this responsibility can be

handled by several different members rather than fall on the shoulders of one or two people.

The team for selection of guest speakers for the General meeting will meet this Thursday afternoon, May 4.

MOTION: Majid made a motion that board members host a monthly party for new members. This party will take place at the home of a board member, with expenses for wine, beer and snacks not to exceed \$750.00 pesos per month.

Majid is going to work on forming a National Charitable Organization outreach program.

Membership: Fr. Jim will be taking over this responsibility while Bob Ryckman is out of the country. He showed the board a fabulous new membership card that will have the members name printed on the card as well as the expiration date. The cards will also be laminated. These cards are very professional in appearance and will cost the organization \$.01 U.S. to laminate.

The procedure for providing these new cards to our members: if a member is planning to renew their membership for 2007, or a new member wishing to join FOM will contact Fr. Jim before the August general meeting, or before any of the following monthly meetings, he will prepare that members card in advance and have it available at the General Meeting. If advanced notice is not possible, the new membership card will be available within the next 2 days.

MOTION: Jacque made a motion that any funds Henri Jarrat raised for secundaria scholarships be matched by the Foundation.

MOTION: Jacque made a motion that \$3,000.00 pesos be spent to supply electricity to the 3 classrooms at Jose Felipe Valle, (El Venadillo) that have the Enciclomedia program.

Motion seconded by Rebecca

Motion approved.

MOTION: Jacque made a motion that \$14,500.00 pesos be spent to purchase uniforms and school supplies for the students at En Busca de una Sonrisa. Majid noted that this commitment is for the school year beginning in August of 06 only.

Motion seconded by Majid

Motion approved

MOTION: Jacque made a motion that FOM administration fund pay for the directors breakfast at Playa Mazatlan on Thursday May 4<sup>th</sup>. Not to exceed \$1,000.00 pesos.

Seconded by Fr. Jim

Motion approved.

On behalf of Mary Carlson, Jacque requested the boards permission for one of the 5<sup>th</sup> grade classes at Josefina Osuna Perez school attend the June FOM General meeting to sing some of the songs that Mary and other FOM volunteer ELS teachers have taught the students.

Jacque presented the board members with an accounting of the Foundations expenditures to date per school, as well as accounts payable and other committed expenses for May.

She told the board that she had done some research on an idea submitted by a member that FOM obtain a Pay Pal account. Majid is going to do further research on this idea.

FR. Jim presented the members services report. He is still updating the Profeco section, but the food item translation section is completed. He thanked Tom Whitmore and Lynne Hopkins for their assistance.

Discount Services: Purple Onion has made a request to be back on the FOM discount directory. Since all previous misunderstanding has been cleared up, they will once again be accepting your membership card for a discount. ## **MEXICAN DRIVER'S LICENSES FOR FOREIGNERS**

For those of us who have or are planning on acquiring a Mexican driver's license here in Mazatlán the government has recently introduced a change in the requirements for foreigners obtaining or renewing Mexican driver's licenses.

To obtain a Mexican Driver's License, the information is in the Survival Guide and requires, attending a class, have a letter from Sharp Hospital with you

blood type, taking both a written and actual driving test. The license is issued to foreigners with an FM2 or FM3 for a period of two years and is renewable.

Foreigners are now required in addition to the above and upon renewing their license to produce a letter from a national stating the foreigner is an upstanding and law-abiding citizen. (A sample copy is given at the end of this article.) and the following documents:

(if renewing) your present license  
a copy of an electric or phone bill showing your cur-

rent Mazatlán address  
a copy of your current FM3 or FM2  
a letter stating you are an upstanding and law-abiding citizen  
a copy of the credential of the person writing the above letter (CREDENCIAL DE ELECTOR) the voter's card  
you must also show your current foreign driver's license and pay the fee of 280 pesos.

Blank form letters for the Mexican National to complete for you are available at the member services table. Following is the sample of that letter which was generously provided by Martha Armenta.

## THE VENADOS SEASON TICKETS ON SALE NOW

Many of our members are avid fans of baseball in the U.S. or Canada. However if you have never been to baseball game here in Mazatlan then you are missing some excellent entertainment! And I am just talking about the people watching! Throw in some MLB class baseball and you have the makings of a great night out. If you are an avid baseball fan or just into people watching then you might consider a Venados season ticket. A season ticket purchased through the end of May will cost you \$1450 pesos, in June and July \$1820 pesos and starting in August \$2345 pesos. A \$200peso deposit will freeze the price and you can pay the balance between now and mid September.

A season ticket entitles you to a reserved seat at the 33 home games. And should the home team make it to the playoffs (they have won the Championship of the league the last two years in row) you are guaranteed to get the same seats that you held during the season. You can buy more expensive season tickets that include reserved parking or for box seats and there is an offer that includes any home playoff games if the Venados make it to the playoffs. The problem with the last offer is that you will lose almost \$1500 pesos if the Venados do not make it to the playoffs!

If you like baseball and a fun high energy environment then I highly recommend the Venados to you. The season begins around mid October and playoffs are through late January. Of course you can always buy single game tickets at the stadium the day of the game or at the Venados office located at Avenida Manuel Gutierrez Najera No. 821. Telephone number is 981-1710.

On Monday, April 24<sup>th</sup>, Lynne Hernandez and I visited the school Jose Felipe Valle (Venadillo) and spent several hours with Salvador Felix Reyes, the Director. We discussed a number of items which addressed the needs of the children for the remainder of this school year and also projected some of the needs for next school year which will begin in September.

Salvador was excited for the upcoming meeting of the Directors of the schools which FOM assists and said that May 4 would be best for him – he is looking forward to this event. He is in favor of the three year plan to project their needs and provide a clearer vision for FOM on how we can best assist the learning of the students at this school.

He explained that the parents' group has exhausted their funds for this school year in the work which was done to complete the baños and repair the security fences around the perimeter of the school. The next monies that will be coming into the school from the parents will be the registration fees in September.

Lilliana, one of the schoolchildren, came running up to me when we arrived at the school and gave me a great big hug. I did not realize that she even knew who I am. She was given enough batteries for her hearing aides to last until June. She will need batteries for the summer months.

We spent time discussing the Encyclomedia program and its impact on Venadillo. The teachers are spending each Friday and Saturday in training sessions learning how to use the equipment and learning the curriculum that comes with it. They have the equipment for the 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, and 6<sup>th</sup> grades at the school now; however, it is NOT operational because there is NO electricity in the three classrooms which have been designated for the program. (This item was discussed at the Board meeting and FOM has approved to pay for the electricity in the three classrooms.)

Olga's new glasses have not arrived yet (these needed special preparation due to the thickness of the lenses which are required). We told Salvador we would check on the progress of these glasses.

Salvador was very pleased to announce that **ALL of the 6<sup>th</sup> grade students** will be going to

*secundario* this next year. He said that most students who are held back will happen between 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grades and he knows of NO dropouts from the 6<sup>th</sup> grade for the fall.

We have ESL teachers lined up for both the fall and winter semesters to teach our English classes in ALL grades. This is due to the fine efforts of Marge Deane and her recruiting these fine people before they left for the summer.

We can be very proud that through your generous donations FOM has made a great impact, not only on the school, but on the entire community. Many children who could otherwise not attend school, are now obtaining an education thanks to you! The pride of parents, students, and staff is abundantly evident in the change in the appearance of the school this year and the enthusiasm of the students that we saw today.

Marge and I thank you for the privilege of serving as Champions to Jose Valle – We also want to thank Lynne Hernandez for her assistance in translating our English into Spanish for Salvador and his staff. We have enjoyed the experience so far and look forward to the coming season.

**Minutes of  
Friends of Mexico  
General Membership Meeting  
April 11, 2006**

A quorum having been established the President, Majid Mir, called the meeting to order at 10:00 A.M. Majid Mir pointed out to the members that the focus of the organization was on service to the members and contributing to the educational needs of underprivileged children in Mazatlan. He stated that a goal this year would be expanding the number of children served. He also noted that the board of directors had its annual retreat the day before and addressed the issues facing Friends of Mexico.

Majid Mir then reviewed the various ways in which the organization provides services to its members. He then discussed ways in which members could help Friends of Mexico. He noted there was a need for an advertising coordinator and well as members who would be willing to contribute stories for the newsletter. There is also a need for an events/trip coordinator and a contributor for the Survival Guide that is cur-

rently being written. Finally he noted that there is a need for School Champions for the schools we support.

Majid Mir discussed the timing of the organization's income and expenses. He pointed out that although the majority of the income was generated during the high season, the vast majority of the expenses we incurred in August in anticipation of the new school year. Therefore, although it may look like we have plenty of money when looking at an income statement in January or February, those funds will be needed when the expenses are incurred in the summer.

Majid Mir stated that the Treasurer's Report was published in the newsletter and asked if everyone had reviewed it. Ed Poses moved that the Treasurer's Report be approved, as submitted. Bruce George seconded the motion and it was passed.
